Our hearts were broken on 28th November 2021 and can never recover.

As a family we have eachhad our difficulties , copying, managing such aloss of a son and brother.

One of our difficulties is trying to understand and having to except the death of Jason (that could have been provented)

My Son a Brother a father who his daughter will never be able to get to know her father.

MH seem to be able to make and change the rules as they go along. They seem to forget that the patients in their care are their for treatment and MH patients are humans beings and not a piece of garbage you just throw out.

When they are not mentally fit for discharge..

All MH patients should be treated as you would like to be treated yourself.

Because I trusted MH I carry the guilt with me for the rest of my life for my Sons death.

A son a brother a father who was so loved by all who new him.

Our hearts are forever broken ...

Jason was discharged 27 November 2001 and we lost him 28 November 2001
