- **ILS in mental health trusts**

ABC informed the group that the mental health scenarios pilot went well and received a positive feedback from the pilot centres.

One of the centres suggested to put the rhythms back in the scenarios as in the 'standard' ILS scenarios (this was changed to just 'shockable/non-shockable' in the mental health scenarios). The group agreed that there is no need for that and the mental health scenarios should stay as they are. The instructors can choose to discuss various rhythms if they feel it would benefit their candidates.

One of the pilot centres suggested adding a sepsis scenario. Again, the group agreed that this was not needed.

A suggestion to remove the ligature scenario was also rejected as the group felt this is an important scenario which should be included in the mental health package.

The group approved the scenarios without any changes and was happy to make them available to all course centres.

ABC informed the group that a new layout was planned for the course materials section on the LMS to incorporate e-ILS materials, and that a folder for the mental health scenarios will be created at the same time.
